The 29^{th} AGM of the AAUP

The 29th Annual General Meeting of the Alumni Association of the University of Peradeniya (AAUP) was held on 25th March 2018 at the Chemistry Lecture Theater. The Chief Guest on the occasion was Professor Ranjini Obeyesekere and Mr. Prasad Kariyawasam was the Guest of Honour.

The ceremony commenced with the lighting of the traditional Oil Lamp followed by the National Anthem. The President of the AAUP, Eng. Sarath Seneviratne welcomed the gathering and thereafter the Vice Chancellor; Professor Upul Dissanayake addressed the gathering. The Chief Guest and the Guest of Honour were introduced by Mrs. Lalitha Gunawardena and Prof. Siril Wijesundara respectively. The Presidents of the AAUP Chapters of Colombo, and Dr. Sarath Jayasooriya form Victoria conveyed greetings from their respective Chapters. AAUP Scholarships were awarded to students who had performed well at examinations.

A key event of the 29th AGM was the felicitation of late Dr. Dharmasena Pathiraja for his contributions to many fields of Art. The felicitation ceremony included citations in English by Prof. Liyanage Amarakeerthi and in Sinhala by Mr. Priyantha Fonseka, followed by the presentation of a memento by the Vice-Chancellor to Mrs. Malini Pathiraja, the wife of late Dr. Dharmasena Pathiraja. Dr. Milinda Pathiraja (son), thanked the AAUP on behalf of the family. The inaugural ceremony of the AGM adjorned with the Vote of Thanks proposed by the General Secretary, Dr. Pradeepa Bandaranayake. Thereafter, the Annual General Meeting of the AAUP was held, where office bearers for the coming year were elected. Fellowship and lunch were held at the Lodge.

Address by the Chief Guest

The Chief Guest at the 29th AGM, Professor Ranjini Obevesekare in her talk reminisced her time at the University of Peradeniya, as the first batch of Arts students to come into residence at the campus. As a senior Alumnus of the University, Prof. verv Obeyesekere spoke on the importance of being passionate about whatever work one chooses or happens to be involved in. According to her, the powerful interest in one's subject or work stays with one through life whatever its vicissitudes and however long one lives. She named a few persons that she knew who have carried this passion for their work, including the late H. A. I. Goonetilleke. A former Librarian of this University he had a passion for Sri Lankan art and culture and had gifted his entire collection of Art and Cultural artifacts and entire collection of library books, to the University of Peradeniya. Prof. Obeyesekere made a request to the university community to build on this lovely campus, a museum to house this stunning collection of 20th century Sri Lankan Art. She also touched on the ethnic violence that erupted in Kandy in the recent past. Her hope is that coming generations of teachers and students, in the years they spend in this multi ethnic campus, exposed to art, beauty, poetry, and much else, will be inspired to do everything in their power to prevent the horrors of such ethnic violence. Prof. Obeyesekere ended her talk with a plea to the younger generation, to have a passion for one's work; compassion and sensitivity to the needs of those around and a core of moral integrity.



Address by the Guest of Honour Mr. Prasad Kariyawasam



Mr. Prasad Kariyawasam, Secretary to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, in his address, described the evolution of the University of Peradeniya from its inception. He stated that during the 1950-1960s the University catered to

undergraduates from all parts of Sri Lanka. During that period undergraduates interacted with students from different social classes, ethnic and religious backgrounds and learnt to understand each other. He reminisced of the period when students were served food in their Halls of residence, where all students had the same meal. Thereafter, Hall canteens were set up when students could buy their meals. Eventually students began to prepare their own food in the Halls of residence, specially the female students. He spoke of his personal experience and said that his home was in Galle and he had never met and interacted with Tamils until he entered the University. He traced the development of the University from the 1970s to the present day and stated that presently most of the undergraduates are from the Central Province. He stressed that the University of Peradeniya should truly be a National University with undergraduates from all parts of the island. This would help Sri Lanka on its journey to become a developed nation in the next ten years.

AAUP Day Trip & Picnic to Rathna Ella, Pokkapitiya & Hunnasgiriya-Range on 01st July 2018

Hunnasgiriya-Pokkapitiya Range is one of the most scenic areas with much greenery and natural beauty, a destination selected for a day trip by Nalin Jayathissa, a committee member who works for the Agrarian Services and is in charge of this region.

There were 28 AAUP participants and we started off at 7:00 am from the usual starting point at the Faculty of Science. We all shared our homemade breakfasts in the bus. Continued sing song by our members added to the gay atmosphere while traveling in the bus. We stopped for short breaks first at Hunnasgiriya and then near the breathtaking view point of the Mahiyangana range at the top of the hill.

After much fun by the stream, we packed our things and headed back to the bus. During our walk to the bus, there was a heavy down pour.

It was a great day indeed for all participants. We returned safely to the Faculty of Science by 6:30 p.m.

Obituary: A Brief Appreciation

It is with deep sorrow we record the passing away of Shanthi de Abrew, a former Director of Physical Education (1983-1989) at Peradeniya University, on the 12th of August 2018, at the age of 84 years. Shanthi was a long standing member of the AAUP, having graduated from the University of Peradeniya in 1956. She was a well known, outstanding sports woman in the 1970's and 1980's, excelling in many sports; high jump, long jump, badminton, tennis, hurdles, to name a few. She was a double international and won Sri Lanka colours for athletics and table tennis, a rare achievement. Shanthi was a graduate with a Bachelor's Degree from Peradeniya University and a Master's Degree in Physical Education from the USA under a Fulbright Award. Shanthi is remembered as an honest, dedicated and committed sports woman, loved by all who knew her.
