A key event of the AGM was the Felicitation of Prof. Malik Peiris, a distinguished alumnus, currently the Chair of Virology at the School of Public Health, University of Hong Kong



In her felicitation speech, Prof Faseeha Noordeen, Virologist and Chair Professor of Microbiology, at Peradeniya University, stressed on the outstanding contributions of Prof. Peiris to the global society through his pioneering research on emerging viral diseases, particularly the SARS virus. She elaborated on the many awards Prof. Peiris received in recognition of his achievements: the first Sri Lanka to be elected to the Royal Society of London, Mahathir Science Award of Malaysia, the Medal "100 Years of Virology" of the D.I. Ivanovsky Institute of Virology of the Russian Academy of Medical Sciences, the Legion d'Honneur of the Republic of France, John Dirks Canada Gairdner Global Health Award and the Chinese equivalent of the Nobel Price. She concluded saying that Prof. Malik Peiris is admired most for his simple ways and lifelong quest to conquer elusive viral infections.

Signing of the termination of the agreement with ILTR



AAUP has been instrumental in producing and selling memorabilia related to the university for many years for the convenience of alumni. There were many drawbacks to this system. Sources of supply varied over the years without a regular supplier which affected the quality of products. Furthermore, EXCO members had to shoulder the responsibility of assuring timely supply and quality products. In 2022, to overcome these problems, the AAUP started discussions with organizations that could collaborate with the AAUP to provide a steady supply of quality products. ILTR was selected for the purpose and signed an agreement for a joint venture. AAUP agreed to fund 50% of the initial expenses of the venture, amounting to Rs. 1,850,000. ILTR was entrusted to provide their expertise to develop a logo, website, publicity, and design of a selected number of memorabilia mostly, clothing.

All the designs were to be approved by the Finance Committee on behalf of the AAUP. The agreed trademark was registered at NIPO by the AAUP, with the advice of ILTR. The initial management of the PERA store, newly located at Getambe, on Peradeniya Road, was to be done by the ILTR. Once the AAUP gained experience and exposure in managing the store, the initial agreement was to terminate. Management of the store is now entirely in the hands of the AAUP. ILTR continues to be the supplier of most items due to the quality and reliability of their supplies.



Dr. Sunil Bowattage, Consultant Physician at the Kandy General Hospital gave an update on **Primary Prevention of Heart Disease** at the Global Forum on held on 27 July 2023 at the Alumni Centre, Gatembe. Addressing the incidence of Non-Communicable Diseases (NCDs), he spoke of the drastic reduction in the life expectancy of Sri Lankans by the year 2045. He elaborated on the main causes of NCD; bad food habits, sedentary lifestyle, obesity, smoking etc. and stressed that 2/3 of NCD deaths are preventable by behavioural changes.



At the Global Forum held at OPA in Colombo on 09 November 2023, Dr. R. H. S. Samarathunga, Senior Economic Advisor to the President, and former Secretary to the Treasury spoke on the Implementation of a debt-for-nature swap program by the government, in the future, subject to the approval of the IMF. He stressed the necessity for a debt restructuring program to obtain the four-year economic adjustment package of 2.9 billion dollars proposed by the IMF and the need to work on this program as soon as possible.

Addressing the 3rd AAUP Global Forum held on 26 February 2024 at the IESL auditorium, Prasad Kariyawasm Lanka's Sri Ambassador to the United States and High Commissioner India. Bhutan, and to Afghanistan spoke on the Impact of foreign policy on the prosperity of Sri Lanka.

Ottawa Chapter Ignites Artistic Talents among Undergraduates



UNIVERSITY DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS

REVIVAL OF THE ART GALLERY AND MUSEUM PROJECT

The AAUP initiated a discussion on establishing an Art Gallery and a Museum to display the art collection of the late Ian Gunatilake on April 12, 2023. The idea of revisiting the long-proposed project was brought about at the last AGM of the AAUP Prof. Kapila Gunasekara, who happened to be the Vice-Chancellor when the art collection was handed over to the University. Some current and past members of the Board of Trustees, the Head of the Department of Fine Arts, and some members of the AAUP ExCo and Prof. Kapila Gunasekara attended the discussion.







Having their lives tightly knit to the University of Peradeniya where they spent almost their entire professional years, the Gunatilake family had decided to donate the art collection they had acquired over the years and in an act of great generosity, to the University of Peradeniya. They hoped thereby to inspire future generations of students with a similar love of art, architecture, and all that was beautiful. Thus, the focal point of the discussion was the importance of displaying these paintings in a gallery that is open to the public. The members of the Board of Trustees explained the background details related to the art collection and the previously proposed building.





The proposed structure, designed by Chartered Architect Ashley de Voss during the early 2000s, was discussed. Based on this design, the glass cubicle, which is meant to be the gallery's entrance, was built in 2014 on Upper Hantana Road and was supposed to be followed by a series of structures, starting from there to reach the University Lake extending as a deck. It was noted during the discussion that, while previously raised funds have been utilized for the construction of the glass cubicle, some remaining funds are available at the University.

Raising additional funds was a vital matter of the discussion, bringing several proposals together with the contact details of influential people, especially the alumni of the University of Peradeniya.

A FACELIFT TO 'THE WALA' GREENROOM



Wala, the most iconic structure in the University of Peradeniya, is the brainchild of Prof. Sarachchandra. Built in the 1950s, it was declared open in 1958 with the staging of the ground-breaking Sinhala play 'Maname'. Over decades, the 'Wala' has staged the best of the world's dramas witnessed by thousands of theatre lovers. The heart of the 'Wala', the greenroom is in a dilapidated condition and can hardly be used with dignity. We started a project in 2019 to renovate the greenroom, however raising funds was difficult due to the COVID-19 pandemic and followed by the economic downfall of the country.

HELPING CAPSU - YET ANOTHER LAUDABLE GESTURE OF THE CANBERRA CHAPTER (AAUPCC)



VICTORIA CHAPTER (PUAAVIC) HAS MADE GENEROUS DONATIONS THIS YEAR TOO!


